Heart Prints Ministry

Our “Heart Prints Ministry,” like so many of our ministries, consistently goes about in a quiet way serving those in our community. Since its inception in 2007, this ministry has served almost 1,000 people in our community not connected with this church.

Who is served...

If you are not familiar with this ministry, it exists “to express appreciation to those who serve our community, especially those who are rarely shown gratitude.” There are those in our community who are rarely, if ever, publicly thanked for the services they render. This ministry exists to seek and thank those groups of people, such as school maintenance workers, garbage collectors, post office employees, nursing home aides, and others who serve us but are too often taken for granted.

How the ministry works...

Recommendations for a group to be recognized are turned in to the Golden Hearts Committee headed by Bob Dillon. Groups are selected for a specific month, contacted, and arrangements made to provide them with a meal and a box of goodies for them to enjoy for the next couple of days. This is simply our way as a body of Christians to let them know they are appreciated by us for what they do in our community.

What can I do...

You can volunteer to help prepare and serve the meals by contacting Bob Dillon. The biggest need we have is providing numerous items for the “box of goodies” that is left for the groups to enjoy. The next two Sundays, you will see a number of burgundy-colored tubs in each lobby. Please help us fill them by purchasing and donating a number of small, nonperishable, prepackaged snacks, such as candy bars, mints, gum, cookies, etc. (no peanut butter items, please). Small lotions, tissues, lip balm, and similar items can also be used.

Why we do it...

More than an obligation to do good and be grateful, both of those should be the heartbeat of every Christian in this congregation. We are served and blessed by so many who deserve our thanks, and this is just one small way to let them know they are not forgotten for the way they serve us.

Jesus said, “Therefore I tell you, do not worry about your life, what you will eat or drink; or about your body, what you will wear. Is not life more important than food, and the body more important than clothes? Look at the birds of the air; they do not sow or reap or store away in barns, and yet your heavenly Father feeds them. Are you not much more valuable than they? Who of you by worrying can add a single hour to his life?”

“And why do you worry about clothes? See how the lilies of the field grow. They do not labor or spin. Yet I tell you that not even Solomon in all his splendor was dressed like one of these.
